Over the last 40 years the life expectancy for people with disabilities has increased by 4.7 years for men and 3.9 years for women; and it is projected to continue to climb over the next decade. One in 10 American children was living in a household with at least one grand-parent in 2010. These dynamics are creating new challenges for older family members and caregivers.

The Center for Family Involvement is evolving with the changes in our society; collaborating with education, health and human service agencies in Virginia to further specialize our outreach to aging people with intellectual and developmental disabilities and their families.
